Our most recent Board of Governors Meeting (December 2010, Chicago) was very productive. It was also very encouraging for me. The Board of Governors plans to evaluate this process and work with the Examinations Committee to find ways to continually improve the quality of the examinations as well as the efficiency of the examination process.

In partnership with the AAVI, our College has organized and sponsored the research symposium as a kickoff event for the annual meeting of the CRWAD. Historically this has been one of the highlights of this meeting. In recent years the attendance had been lagging. However, this year's attendance was much stronger and feedback from the attendees was very positive. I appreciate the effort of Dr. Chris Chase and the CE committee and I congratulate them for organizing a successful research symposium, Emerging and Re-emerging Zoonotic Pathogens.

As we move into the election season for our college, I want to recognize the efforts of Dr. Sanjeev Narayanan and the Nominating Committee for successfully assembling a strong slate of candidates for upcoming openings on the Board of Governors as well as strong candidates for honorary diplomacy

and the Distinguished Microbiologists of the Year Award. These processes will be going forward in the spring of 2011.

Once again, hardy congratulations to Dr. Roy Curtiss, the Honorary Diplomate for 2010, and Dr. Fred Murphy, the Distinguished Microbiologists of the Year Award recipient for 2010. It was a great pleasure to present these awards on behalf of the College to these great scientists and splendid persons.

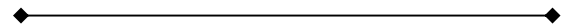

Dr. Curtiss received his B.Sc. from Cornell University and his Ph.D. from the University of Chicago. He began his professional career teaching at Cornell and moved to the University of Tennessee where he was a professor of microbiology. Next, he worked at the University of Alabama followed by Washington University where he had an endowed chair. Dr. Curtiss is currently

Director, Center for Infectious Diseases and Vaccinology at Arizona State University. He served on a multitude of private sector, university, national and international committees. In 2001, he was elected to the National Academy of Sciences. He has a long list of honorary titles, a highly impressive list of publications, and several patents.

His research interests are in the area of infectious diseases with emphasis on pathogenesis, control, and prevention. His work has touched on issues of importance to animal and human health. Dr. Curtiss has contributed a remarkable body of work in these areas and his contributions are highly acknowledged. Roy is a master teacher and his former students are distinguished researchers. ACVM board meeting in Chicago, Illinois

The ACVM held a meeting on December 5, 2010 in conjunction with the CRWAD meeting in Chicago, Illinois. Following is a brief summary of some of the meeting discussions. Chris Hayhow reported that we have renewed our non-profit status with the State of Illinois for 2011. Chris Hayhow summarized the financial status of the college. On December 31, 2009, we had a balance of \$46,835.09 in our checking account and \$16,785.94 in CD's, for a total of \$63,621.03. On October 31, 2010, we had a balance of \$51,867.14 in our checking account and \$17,243.11 in CD's, for a total of \$69,110.25. A detailed itemized report of our income and expenses for the last year was reviewed. The proposed budget for 2011 was reviewed and approved. Rebecca Morton (OK) was approved for ACVM Emeritus status. Congratulations Rebecca on this well deserved award! It was also reported that Johnnes "Hans" Storz (CO) had recently passed away. There was a moment of silence in his memory. Dr. Amelia Woolums, Chair of the ACVM Examinations Committee reported that the pass rate was 60% for the general examination and 75% for the specialty examinations. This year we had fifteen (15) candidates sit for the general exam with nine (9) achieving a passing score (9/15 or 60%). Seven (7) candidates sat for the virology examination and four (4) passed (4/7 or 57%). Six (6) candidates sat for the immunology examination and two (2) passed

(2/6 or 33.3%). Twelve (12) candidates sat for the bacteriology / mycology examination and three (3) passed (3/12 or 25%). There were nine (9) passing scores for the 25 specialty examinations administered (9/25 or 36%). The net result was seven (7) new diplomates were certified and two (2) diplomates added an additional specialty. The new diplomates for 2010, which were certified in Virology are Hayley Adams, Ratish Gambhira, Amar Patil, and Kamesh Sirigireddy. Our college can be very proud of the quality of these annual symposia. Fund raising efforts are under way to support the ACVM activities at the 2011 CRWAD meeting. All financial support is appreciated. If you have any information concerning potential contributors please contact Scott McVey. At the 2010 CRWAD meeting we bestowed the fifth "Distinguished Veterinary Microbiologist" award to Dr. Frederick A. Murphy. Congratulations Dr. Murphy on receipt of this prestigious award. If you are aware of a potential candidate for this award please contact the ACVM Nominating Committee for more details. In 2011, we will elect three new ACVM Board of Governors' members. If you are interested in running for the ACVM Board please contact Sanjeev Narayanan, Chair of the ACVM Nominating Committee for more details. Steven Olsen, Chair of the ACVM Graduate Students Award Committee reported that his committee worked very hard evaluating the posters and oral presentation at the 2010 CRWAD meeting. The winners are reported elsewhere in this newsletter. Secretary Treasurer Chris Hayhow reported that we continue to make progress on potentially adding a new specialty to our college. The parasitology group submitted a petition to AVMA on November 1, 2009, and we submitted a letter in support of their request to be added to our college. These documents were reviewed by AVMA and the American Board of Veterinary Specialties (ABVS). The recommendation was to move ahead with the proposal. In accordance with the AVMA / ABVS requirements, the proposal is now out for public comments from the AVMA membership. The

comments will be summarized and reviewed by the ABVS members at their meeting in February 2011. It is anticipated that the ABVS will vote at that time whether to recommend approval of parasitology as a specialty within ACVM. If the vote is to approve the recommendation then the AVMA Council on Research will evaluate the proposal at their spring meeting in 2011. If the Council on Research approves the recommendation from ABVS then parasitology will be a specialty within ACVM. In the meantime, it was agreed that we need to set up a transition team to ensure we are prepared to welcome the new parasitology specialty. The goal of the transition team is to prepare guidelines for our new colleagues and to address potential issues that might develop with the addition of the new specialty. We will continue to keep everyone updated on the activities and progress.
