A full-time (12-month) clinical track faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor is open in the WSU College of Veterinary Medicine (CVM). The position is defined as 45% clinical diagnostic service and teaching, 35% pre-clinical instruction, and 20% scholarly activity. Duties include: a) diagnostic veterinary pathology service in WADDL, b) teaching virology in the second (pre-clinical) year of the DVM curriculum, c) clinical instruction of fourth year DVM students rotating through the “Diagnostics/Necropsy” block, d) training post-DVM veterinary anatomic pathology graduate students/residents, e) scholarship in the form of peer reviewed publications, and f) academic service to the CVM, department, and diagnostic lab. The expectations for scholarly activity may be met through publication of diagnostic case materials and collaborative research.

Applicants must have a) DVM (or equivalent) degree, b) successful completion of a post-DVM residency training program in veterinary anatomic pathology, and c) American College of Veterinary Pathologists (or currently certified by European College of Veterinary Pathologists), or board examination eligibility and intention to become an ACVP diplomate. The preferred candidate will have experience teaching veterinary students, a record of peer-reviewed publication, and a Ph.D. degree in pathology, microbiology, immunology, infectious disease or related field. However, a PhD is not required and development of an independent extramurally funded research program is not expected.

Review of applications will begin on March 5, 2016. Applications will be reviewed until the position is filled. The starting date for the successful candidate will be negotiable.
